



## Terms of Reference

### Consultancy Service for the Development of a Monitoring Instrument for WASSCE 2021

#### 1.0 Background

Africa Education Watch in partnership with OXFAM is monitoring the conduct of the 2021 West African Senior Secondary Certificate Examinations (WASSCE) as part of strategies to demand accountability in the governance of the pre-tertiary education assessment sub sector. As part of the implementation processes, Eduwatch seeks the services of a consultant to develop a Monitoring Tool for the conduct of the WASECE 2021. The tool will be used by school level monitors to collect data on key indicators of standards, compliance, accountability, and questions security for engaging the Ministry of Education on assessment sector reforms.

#### 2.0 Objective of the Assignment

The **objective of this assignment** is to develop a monitoring instrument for the conduct of the WASSCE 2021.

#### 3.0 Scope of Work

The Consultant is expected to develop a quantitative and qualitative monitoring tool for use by school level monitors during WASSCE 2021. The tracking process involves activities before and during the writing of papers during the WASSCE 2021 papers.

#### 4.0 Assignment Timeframe

The assignment shall span four days, commencing 5<sup>th</sup> to 9<sup>th</sup> September 2021. An all-inclusive lump sum consultancy fee of GHC 4,000 shall be paid to the Consultant after submission of final report, subject to statutory tax requirements.

#### 5.0 Required Qualifications and Experience

The Consultant must have the following qualifications and experience: -

- A University degree in education, development studies or other equivalent qualification.

- Knowledge and understanding of the secondary education sector of Ghana
- Experience in invigilation of WASSCE
